Thank you to all the parents, grandparents, and friends who are cooperating fully with our efforts to make dismissal traffic flow more smoothly. Because cars were arriving as early as 2:15 and parking along the curb in front of church, traffic was backing up on Lime City Road and buses could not turn into our lot. To remedy the situation we ask the following:

If you arrive early, you have two options:

- You may park in front of the McAlear and wait for your child to exit from the McAlear Center.
- You may follow the traffic pattern to the parking lot area closest to the creek. Cars will line up in that area. As soon as buses leave through the area located in the middle section of the parking lot, cars may pull along the curb for pick-up just as they do in the morning.

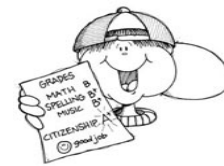
