Dear Parents,

I want to take this opportunity as the school year comes to a close and we look forward to next year to thank you for allowing us to work with you in the education and faith formation of your child/ren. This has been a wonderful first year for me to work with students, parents and teachers in this outstanding educational community of All Saints!

As you know, I have ministered in several Catholic schools in the Toledo Diocese and two other states and have found ASCS to be top notch in the education provided to our young people. Our teachers and staff are highly dedicated professionals who hold high standards for academics, reinforce the importance of actively living the values of Jesus, and are committed to caring for your children as if they were their own. What a blessing it has been to me minister in such a great community!

The All Saints School Advisory Council worked this year toward defining its role, keeping current on the progress of the Diocesan Metro Toledo Task Force and Ohio School Legislation efforts. The Council also set goals to promote enrollment, increase marketing, and promote parent involvement. To help achieve this goal, The School Advisory Council and Parish Finance Council have affirmed the value of hiring a part-time Advancement and Marketing Communications Director for All Saints. I hope to have this position filled by July 1.

A heart-felt thank you to our parents who have served this year on our School Advisory Council: President Laurie Nawrocki, Vice President Julie Jardine, Secretary MaryJo Kale, Marie Kraus, Kristine Malik, Joe Reichert, Bridgett Root, Kevin Stawinski, and Rick Delvecchio. Special thanks to Julie Jardine who is concluding her three-year term and to Laurie Nawrocki who is coming to the end of her second term. We are grateful for their dedication to Catholic education, their insights, assistance, and personal gifts that they shared so generously in this capacity for our school and parish.

The Falcon Club has also worked hard to invite family participation in events including the Back to School Swim Party, Donuts for Dads, Easter Egg Hunt, Mother's Day Luncheon, Uniform Sale, just to name a few, and willingly assisted in many other activities that involved food, beverages and desserts! They also coordinated fundraisers to be able to provide the family activities above; purchase hard-cover Bibles for all 4th graders and new students (annually); cover the cost of our Bowl-a-Thon; and put in countless hours to acquire donations, organize and host the Falcon Fest which netted \$7,212.68! Five thousand of this is promised back to the school to help fill that gap between the actual cost per student and the amount of tuition we ask our parents to pay.

At the suggestion of the Falcon Club Officers and the agreement of the School Advisory Council, we will be exploring new options to re-energize our parent association to encourage more participation of parents, review the overall purpose of a parent association, and evaluate the fundraisers held throughout the year. I wish to thank the Falcon Club Officers who served so generously this past year: President Patti Kelley, Vice President Miranda Hinojosa, Treasurer Andrea Ohrt, Secretary Wendy Jakubec, and Volunteer Coordinator Stephanie Henderly. At the end of this school year they will all have completed the terms of their offices. I invite you also to take a moment to reflect on the school year and, on the Looking Back...Looking Forward paper attached, briefly share your feedback, affirmations and suggestions as we plan for next year.

I am very excited to announce that next year we will be offering an option for our 6th, 7th and 8th graders to take an online Elementary Spanish I course via Moodle. Teachers at ASCS utilize Moodle to provide information and links to websites for your students to enhance the curriculum, however, Moodle is also a course management system designed for schools and universities to deliver online instruction. The course will be taught by a Spanish teacher in one of our diocesan schools, St. Joseph Central Catholic, Fremont, Ohio. Mrs. Debra Streacker is the course creator and instructor who holds a Bachelor's degree in Spanish from The Ohio State University and a Master's degree from University of Findlay in Bilingual Education and TESOL (Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages). Last year the course was taught successfully in other diocesan schools; the report from administrators and teachers has been very positive. Students in grades 5-7 have received more specific information parents will want to review so that enrollment can begin for those middle school students who are interested.

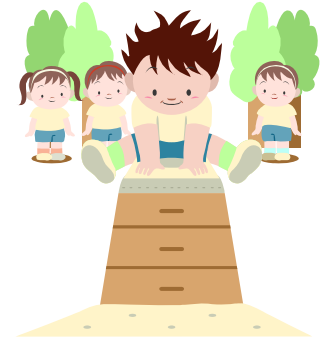
Schedule of Events:

Dear Parents of Current 6th Grade Students:

In 2010, a new immunization requirement was announced by the Ohio Department of Health.

The requirement is the addition of a DPT (diphtheria, pertussis & tetanus) **booster for seventh-grade students**. It is not too early to call your child's doctor and schedule an appointment for the **required DPT immunization he/she must have before entering 7th grade at any school in the State of Ohio**.

There is a 4 day "grace" period which allows a student to attend school for the first 4 days without the immunization. However, after 4 days the student will not be able to return until the immunization has been received. This rule applies to all age and interval minimums and the rule will be enforced at All Saints Catholic School.

All Saints Falcons Athletic Association News

The 2010-2011 All Saints Catholic School Athletic program was a huge success thanks to the sportsmanship of the participating athletes and the dedication of many coaches and parents. All Saints was represented in six sport seasons, consisting of cross country, football, fall soccer, volleyball, basketball and spring soccer.

In order to keep the cost of athletics as reasonable as possible, the All Saints Athletic Association sponsored two fundraisers during the year. Entertainment Books were sold at the beginning of the school year, and the Annual Basketball Jamboree was held in November. Profits from these events are used to cover a portion of team fees, which were \$4,050 for this year. The team fee is paid by the All Saints Athletic Association directly to CYO for each team to participate in the CYO program. This is in addition to the individual player fees that are collected at registration. Additional expenses for the year included subsidizing class trips in return for concession stand help, paying tournament fees, purchasing team uniforms, basketballs, first aid kits and additional supplies for the AED units (defibrillators) located throughout the school. A donation was also made to All Saints School to assist in a future purchase of mulch for the playground.

None of these things would be possible without a great number of volunteers. Please consider buying an Entertainment Book next fall. These books will be coming home with All Saints School students on the first day of the 2011-2012 school year. Another great way to earn service hours and help your school is to volunteer to assist at the Basketball Jamboree or any other tournaments that our school may host. More information regarding volunteer opportunities will be available next school year. Thank you for your continued support of our athletic programs.
