- a new option(s) (if you wish)

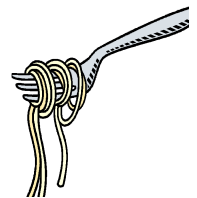


Return completed form and ***check made payable to Lifetouch*** to your child's teacher by **Monday, September 21.**

Arrival Time

Classes begin at 7:55 AM, starting with announcements and prayer. Arrival may be as early as 7:30 AM but not before. Students are encouraged to arrive before 7:55 in order for them to get organized for the day. If your child is participating in Extended Learning which starts at 7:30 AM, then he/she is required to go directly to the library for instruction at 7:30 AM – not before and not after. Since this is a short time period for extra support, the disruption is not fair to the students who arrive on time.

School Health Inspections (Formerly Jarod's Law)

"Below is information from the Catholic Conference of Ohio regarding Jarod's Law and school health inspections:

HB1 (the state budget bill) repealed Jarod's Law and replaced it with new requirements. In summary:

- *HB1 repeals current law under which Boards of Health, using standards and procedures adopted by the Ohio Department of Health, must inspect public and chartered nonpublic schools and their grounds at least annually to identify conditions dangerous to public health and safety.*
- *Boards of Health are now required to inspect the sanitary condition of schools semi-annually, rather than annually.*
- *HB1 also repeals authorization for a Board of Health to close a school for imminent public health threat other than for an epidemic or a high prevalence of communicable disease.*
- *Public and chartered nonpublic schools are required to periodically review their policies and procedures to ensure the safety of persons using the school from known hazards that pose an immediate risk to health or safety and compliance with federal law.*

Although schools are required to be inspected twice per year, there are no rules or standards to which those inspections must adhere. Historically, ODH Bureau of Environmental Health provided guidance for the conduct of these inspections. ODH will continue to recommend the use of the school inspection manual (what was Jarod's Law) for conducting sanitary school inspections."
