## Morning Drop-off

There is a concern that a dangerous situation is created when parents drop their children off at the curb and then wait until the children reach the school doors. When this happens, cars either become backed up or cars start passing the stopped car. It has been

suggested that, if you want to see your child to the door, park and then take him/her to the door in person. This would expedite drop-off time and keep the parking lot safe.

## From the Clinic/Mrs. Lada

We want to inform you that we have a reported case of head lice in the school. Lice checks of other students were done on Wednesday, September 1, and no further cases were found. However, we ask you to be proactive by very closely checking your child’s hair and scalp. Dandruff will easily flake off the hair shaft, but the nit (egg) of head lice is sticky and adheres to the individual hair shaft. Treatment should be considered only if active lice or viable eggs are observed. The nits (eggs) are usually the initial indication of head lice infestation. Nits are not “moving or crawling things.” Nits may be pearly white, yellow or tan. They are about the size of a typewritten comma and are firmly attached to the hair shaft. “Live” nits are usually found within ¼ or ½ inch of the scalp. After the nit hatches, the louse is a bug that shies away from the light and crawls very quickly through the

hair, making it very difficult to spot, unless there is a heavy infestation. If you are unsure after reading this or need assistance, please call the school nurse or your child's physician.

If your child is identified and treated, a daily nit check at home is advisable for at least 10 days following treatment. You may need to re-treat in 7-10 days if there is evidence of new nits or newly hatched lice. If your child has a confirmed case of lice, they may be admitted back into school after the nurse has confirmed all evidence of head lice is gone and live or dead nits have been eliminated. Head lice are most common in school-aged children and are not associated with any socio-economic class or lack of cleanliness of an individual or family. The condition can be difficult to control unless there is cooperation and follow-through in treatment. It is vitally important now, and at any time in the future, that every case or possible case of lice and all such contagious conditions be reported immediately to the school nurse to avoid cross-contamination. Thank you very much for your continued cooperation in the weeks ahead.
