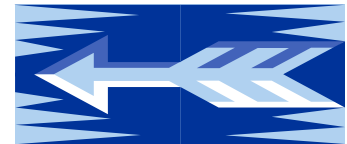
What's for Dinner Friday?

Nurse's Notes

Many parents have been sending **over-the-counter medications** to be given to their children during the school day. We kindly ask that you check the parent handbook for procedures related to dispensing over-the-counter medications which include cough drops, Tylenol & Ibuprofen, cold medication, etc. Any purchased item used to treat symptoms of illness without a prescription is over-the-counter medication. The form to be completed for dispensing over-the-counter medications can be obtained by calling the school office.

Clean shirts and pants are routinely kept in the clinic for children who spill something on themselves, get dirty at recess, or accidentally wear the wrong clothing to school. If your child comes home wearing borrowed clothing from the clinic, please wash the clothing as soon as possible and return the item(s) to the clinic. We have quite a bit of clothing which has not been returned and we are running low on many sizes. Donations of gently used clean shirts, pants, jumpers, skirts and belts are gladly accepted. If you have sizes you no longer need and would like to send them to school, it would be appreciated.



Testing

During the weeks of September 28-October 16, elementary students in the Diocese of Toledo will be engaged in a comprehensive assessment program. Students in Grades 2-8 will begin their third year of working with the diagnostic/assessment tool called the "Performance Series" by Scantron Corporation. This is a computer adaptive test that students take online. There are many advantages to this type of assessment. One is that teachers and school administrators will have access to a student's performance within minutes of testing. Student performance data will be available to teachers twenty-four hours a day at a secure password protected website. This feature helps teachers plan instruction to and set interventions to meet students' needs. Please look at the attachment to view a complete schedule of testing dates and times.

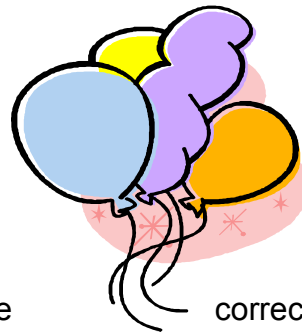
