Dear All Saints Parents:

A first grade student has a confirmed case of the Chicken Pox.

Chickenpox is a highly infectious disease that spreads from person to person by direct contact or by air from an infected person's coughing or sneezing. Touching the fluid blister can also spread the disease. A person with chickenpox is infectious from one to five days before the rash appears. The contagious period continues until all blisters have formed scabs, which may take 5 to 10 days. It takes from 10 to 21 days after contact with an infected person for someone to develop chickenpox.

Chickenpox (varicella) is often heralded by a prodrome of anorexia, muscle aches, nausea, fever, headache, and malaise in adolescents and adults, while in children the first symptom is usually the development of a blister-like rash, followed by development of tiredness, fever (a temperature of 100-102F, but may be as high as 106F in rare cases), and anorexia. Rarely cough, runny nose, nausea and gastrointestinal distress has been reported in patients with varicella. Typically, the disease is more severe in adults

Can you still get chickenpox after being vaccinated?

- Most people who get chickenpox vaccine will not get chickenpox. However, because chickenpox vaccine is made from a live, but weakened form of the chickenpox virus, there is a small risk of getting chickenpox after the vaccine.
- If someone who has been vaccinated does get chickenpox, it is usually very mild, much milder than if they had been infected through natural exposure to the chickenpox virus.
- They usually have fewer spots, are less likely to have fever and recover more quickly
